

Is it Hate Speech or Free Speech?

Description: How do we navigate the new norms of the evolving 21st century? How do we speak authentically, and yet still be held accountable for our choice of words? Join us as we talk through the weight of our words and how they can best be used and how, if at all, they need to be monitored (think cancel culture/SM bans).

Ground Rules

(go around and get verbal agreement). Further, you agree to adhere to the principles outlined already: to deliver your perspectives bound to the principles of respect, to listen with humility and offer grace to others who are sharing this space.

Remember to ask to record and PRESS RECORD

(2) Free Speech 5 – 10 min.

- The First Amendment states: Congress shall make no law abridging freedom of speech.
- What forms of speech are limited or excluded from First Amendment free speech rights?

(3) Hate Speech 10 - 15 min.

- How would you define hate speech? What would be some examples of hate speech?
- Is there any hate speech that should not be protected by the First Amendment, and why or why not?

(4) Hate Speech or Free Speech: Specific examples 25 - 30 min.

- Should specific groups identified as hate groups such as the KKK or the Aryan
 Brotherhood be allowed to march through a black or Jewish neighborhood, and why or
 why not?
- Should public universities or similar community spaces be able to refuse a controversial speaker because their speech is likely to be perceived as hateful or because of security concerns, and why or why not?
- Should social media platforms such as Facebook or Twitter be able to refuse to publish a specific post because the social media platform labels that post as hateful, and why or why not? What about lies and misinformation that cause harm to public health, should they be able to prohibit that as well?
