(2) Feelings and thoughts

- How did you feel when the election results were confirmed? Do you believe the results are complete and valid or are you waiting?
- How do you feel now that time has passed since the election?
- Are you hopeful/concerned?
- Not everything, in every election, is always black and white. Why do people sometimes support candidates who say things or pledge actions seemingly contrary to the voter's own interests and life?

(3) The "most important election in our lifetime" or not

10 - 15 min.

• When you look at this election, in particular, do you feel it was more, less or about the same in importance to others in your lifetime? Why?

(4) More together or more divided?

10 - 15 min.

• Do you feel these election results help or hinder America and her relationship with her allies? Are we more united or divided?

(5) The voting decision process

15 - 20 min.

- What were the key factors in why you voted as you did?
- Do you feel a two party system, such as you have in the US works again unifying the country? Would more parties alleviate that tension?
- Is it important that the President have exceptional character?
- Who has the label of Socialism and when you hear that, what does it mean?
