(2) Purpose of businesses in general

10 - 15 min.

- What is the most important purpose or goal of a business?
- Do businesses have a purpose or responsibility beyond maximizing their owner's profits?
 If yes, what are those larger purposes or goals?

(3) Woke capitalism 15 - 20 min.

- In 2015 New York Times columnist, Ross Douthat, coined the term "woke capitalism," defining it as how companies signal their support for progressive or liberal causes in order to maintain their influence in society. Do you feel that this is a real thing?
- If woke capitalism is a real thing, why do you think these businesses are publicly stating their approval for progressive or liberal causes and positions? Are they being bullied into supporting progressive or liberal positions?
- Are these woke businesses also rejecting conservative causes and positions, and why?
 Are they being bullied into rejecting conservative positions?
- Given how polarized government has become, do corporations need to play a bigger role in helping us do what's right or is that playing with fire?

(4) Businesses on discrimination issues

15 - 20 min.

Should businesses publicly weigh in on discrimination issues or causes such as
dismantling institutionalized racism or Black Lives Matter or bathroom laws or religious
freedom issues, and why or why not? Is weighing in on discrimination issues good for
their business or not, and why or why not?

(5) Businesses on voting rights issues

10 - 15 min.

 Should businesses publicly weigh in on voting rights issues or causes and why or why not? Is this weighing in on voting rights issues good for their business or not, and why or why not?
